








How would you rate your overall satisfaction with the MMM program?





Why did you choose the University of Mannheim for your master studies? (multiple answers possible)





Which of the following sources did you use to inform yourself about the MMM before your application? (multiple answers possible)



How would you rate the overall admission process to the MMM program (application procedure, support with information, etc.)?




Which other universities did you consider when applying for a master program?

*“Provide a more detailed webpage to explain the **scoring system**, with cutoffs of recent years.”*





When applying for the MMM did you already have a certain specialization in mind?




When applying for the MMM, did you already know in which job you are planning to work in your future?





Area Specialization




Area Satisfaction



In how many courses this semester were you required to buy a printed script from the chair?*





1. Issues with the course structure – gap between lecture and exercise

>20x

- “Lecture and exercise classes have a **huge gap** that cannot be easily closed, and **exercises are quite difficult**”
- “Lectures and exercises are completely on **different levels**”
- “A lot of content from the lecture was **not helpful** to solve the problem sets by yourself.”
- “Couldn't imagine a such **badly structured module.**”
- “This course overall was a disaster. After years of complaining about the course structure **nothing has changed** for the better. The lectures and live sessions were very **confusing, exercises way more difficult than the concepts explained.**”

3. Practical relevance

- “**No practical relevance at all** - doesn't fit into a master's program”
- “**Shouldn't be mandatory** as useless for most specializations and cumbersome”
- “I'm **unsure how this could ever be useful for a career outside of academia.**”

4. Workload

- “**Very high workload** to prepare for the exam”
- “It's a lot of work compared to other classes”
- “It's too much effort and **too much input** for 6 ECTS.”

2. Quality of exercise sessions and material

- “The tutorials were **rather useless** as the tutor **did not seem to understand what they were doing**”
- “**Chaotic** exercise sessions, very **overwhelming exam preparation**”
- “What was most frustrating was that the TAs made so **many mistakes.**”
- “Unfortunately, tutorials were **not helpful**”
- “Slides are **no real study aid.** Overall provided material seems rather low quality”

5. Positive feedback and suggestions for improvement

- “It's a lot of work compared to other classes, but the Professor was really **helpful and open to discuss** anything.”
- “Excellent job of professor, **very well-thought-out concept**”
- “Great Professor, he explained the content super well in the **videos.**”
- “**Solutions for old exams** would be helpful.”
- “The professor is really nice, but **more exercises for self-study** would be helpful.”
- “Would be nice to have **real-life examples.**”

“An exam on our computers would make way more sense, considering the topics involved.”

*“Prof. Glanzer is very **motivated** and always **open to students’ suggestions.**”*

*“Very nice and motivated professor. The topics you have to study for the exam are **clearly defined and manageable.** Very fair exam.”*

*“Grading was favorable, but **many mistakes also in the exam.**”*

*“**Exam results were extremely poor**, it seems hard to believe that it’s all down to us students being lazy”*

*“**High workload** but the concept of recorded lectures/exercises is good.”*

*“The professor has **low social competence** and is very **unfriendly** to his students via emails”*

*“**Good combination of programming and theory**. But: excessive workload with 13 lectures + programming tutorials. The exercise format, where the **lecturers will basically kick you out** if you haven't prepared the exercise thoroughly, doesn't provide any benefit.”*

*“Can't really be an equivalent of the Empirical Methods course as it is **more advanced**”*

*“Workload is too high, and the professor is **not so good at explaining the study materials.**”*

*“Good professor and good tutors but the **workload** is way too much compared to the amount of credits for the course.”*

*“Too much **time pressure in exam**”*

*“The **exam was much harder** than the exercises or the old exams”*

“Structure was good! Grading was really not fair.”

*“Good lectures and exercises, very much **theoretical input to learn by heart.**”*

*“I haven’t yet understood the benefit from **rushing through exercises** due to time pressure.”*

*“Very nice lecturer, interesting topics! **Useful for future work with R, and the seminar/master thesis.**”*

“Professor is just reading his slides.”

1. Course format, structure and delivery >20x

- “Good idea, **bad execution**”
- “Hopefully the sustainability chair can take over soon – this class is just a **bad compromise**”
- “There were **no foundational concepts** and most professors didn’t really care.”
- “**Content delivery is often relatively poor** depending on the lecturer.”
- “A bit too **superficial** with many lectures but short contents each”
- “Course structure **needs improvement** (at least having all lectures from one area in a row).”
- “Super bad structure, it seemed so **random and not linked at all**.. It would be highly **appreciated if one professor would teach everything**.”

2. Exam preparation and communication 10x

- “Q&A for the exam was **cancelled** so it was hard to find out anything about how to prepare for it.”
- “The lectures and **study load** per lecturer were **very uneven**.”
- “**Very bad communication about what to expect in the exam**”

3. Coordination 8x

- “Bad concept! The different chairs that present the lectures are **not coordinating/connecting their contents at all**.”
- “**Content repetition** in every lecture and multiple pieces of only subordinate use cases of CSR or ESG”
- “More coordination between the lecturers would be great. E.g., Vomberg **with extra readings vs. everyone else**.”

4. Exam grading and workload 9x

- “Exam grading has **no standards** between the different areas and chairs.”
- “**Unfair grading**”
- “Exam grading is **very untransparent**.”
- “The exam was way **too detailed** and badly graded for the **information volume** covered in every lecture.”
- “**Too many professors with different requirements on the tasks in the exam**”








Have you started/completed a seminar thesis this semester?






...the overall provision of information before deciding on a chair?




...the variety of topics?






...the opportunity to influence your topic?




...the formal support by the chair?




...the time frame of the seminar thesis?






Did you write your Master's thesis in cooperation with a company?



Does it differ from the chair of your seminar thesis?




What system of assigning the topics did the chair use?




Do you suppose that the topic of your master thesis helps your professional career?


















Did you receive an offer for an exchange semester?*






Did you receive an offer for a Double Degree or EMT-Program?*





Did you spend your semester in Mannheim or abroad?








How would you rate the provision of information for the preparation for the semester abroad?






How would you rate the conversion of the grades received abroad?




