



### **Basic Structure**

The Mannheim Master in Management of the University of Mannheim is a consecutive Master's degree program which concludes with the academic degree "Master of Science".



The MMM distinguishes itself through a high degree of flexibility in the planning of the course of studies. There are only five mandatory courses for all students along with the mandatory seminar and master's thesis. All other classes can be chosen freely from the following six areas without formally committing to any one <u>area</u>:

- Accounting and Taxation
- Finance
- Information Systems
- Management
- Marketing and Sales
- Operations Management

The regular duration of study is 4 semesters. The Thesis must be completed, and all 120 credit points have to be collected by the end of the 7th semester. You can take a maximum of two leaves of absence ("Urlaubssemester") e.g., for internships. However, the first semester is not granted for a leave of absence.

### **Compulsory Modules**

Disclaimer: The order and timing of when you do the compulsory modules is **completely up to you**. In the MMM you create the time schedule of your studies and can allocate the courses according to your needs.

Within the MMM, 28 of the total 120 ECTS are reserved for **compulsory ("core") courses**. During your master's studies, you're therefore required to complete the following courses:

BE 510 Business Economics I	6 ECTS
BE 511 Business Economics II	6 ECTS
CC 501 Decision Analysis: Business Analytics II	6 ECTS
CC 503 Empirical Methods: Business Analytics I	
or CC 502 Applied Econometrics	6 ECTS
CC 504 Corporate Social Responsibility	4 ECTS

### **Electives and Elective Areas**

You can find a comprehensive offering of elective courses and areas, detailed descriptions of all offered courses, as well as possible registration deadlines in the most recent module catalog on the Business Schools' website.

Up to 24 ECTS can be earned in an Elective such as Computer Science, Political Science, Psychology, Language Studies, History, Sociology, Philosophy and more. Please make sure to follow the set rules of the module catalog. Electives that are not completed precisely according to the rules cannot be credited towards your degree. If you would like to drop an elective, you must make up the missing ECTS in the field of business administration. For further questions, please contact your program manager Kevin Pfeffel.

### **Seminar and Master Thesis**

Your program includes a total of 30 ECTS of scientific research. From these, 6 are reserved for your seminar research paper, and the remaining 24 for your master's thesis. You can apply for the seminar thesis and your master's thesis at your preferred chair. The different areas and chairs have varying application requirements and prerequisites, so be sure to plan ahead.

Some professors require the students to have written a seminar paper within their chair or area in order to apply for the master's thesis with the same chair.

The application for many seminar papers also requires the completion of prerequisite courses. The best resource for planning courses and checking requirements is the module catalog as well as the chairs' websites. Make sure to plan ahead to fulfill these requirements when selecting your modules each semester.

### 2.2 Student Portal, Ilias & E-Mail

### Portal2/Student Portal

You can access the student portal via the following address: https://portal2.uni-mannheim.de. You can log in with your university identification ("Uni-ID"), which is a combination of your first and last name, as a username. You should have received this ID with your matriculation notice.



Portal 2 is mainly used for course registration and exam registration. Detailed instructions for the exam processes can be found in the next section under 2.3. Additionally, in Portal 2, you will find all kinds of documents such as your matriculation certificate, information on the payment of semester fees, and, after correction, your exam grades.



Since the university's computing center (UNIT) continuously improves the student portal, it is worth exploring each menu item on your own. This way, you can get a feeling for the system and memorize the most important navigation points.

### **ILIAS**

ILIAS is the learning management system of the University of Mannheim. It contains study materials as well as discussion forums for direct exchange with the chairs and your fellow students for most of your courses. To access ILIAS, log in with your university identification ("UniID"), , as your username at: <a href="https://ilias.uni-mannheim.de/">https://ilias.uni-mannheim.de/</a>

When you enroll in courses, they should usually appear directly in your ILIAS. If this is not the case, enter the name of the course you are looking for in the search field at the top of the page. After you find the correct course, click on the arrow under "Actions" and choose "Join." The course folder will be saved to your "Dashboard," where you can access it at any time.

### **Email**

The most important communication channel from the university and the Dean's Office to you is the email distribution list, through which you will regularly receive information emails. Therefore, it is important that you have properly set up your email account. Here you can find instructions on how to access your email account:

### 2.3 Exam registration and cancellation

### I. Exam Registration

You must register for all exams. The registration for your first attempt in any must be done independently in Portal2 during the registration period. Exceptions exist for modules that can be taken simultaneously (see module catalog) and elective exams. In these cases, registration is done directly through the examination office (informally via email).

Seminars (700-level modules) and the master's thesis must be registered with the responsible examiner for each exam attempt. These registrations are forwarded to the examination office. For module exams in the areas of Methods and Key Qualifications, Business Economics, and Business Administration, there is an early registration period. Exams in an elective can be registered for either during the early or regular registration period.

For exams in the areas of Methods and Key Qualifications and Business Economics, you can choose to register for the first or second exam date; however, registration for exams in the areas of Business Administration and electives is only possible for the first date.

### II. Step-by-Step Registration Guide Registration:

### Where:

Log in to Portal2 and open the "Study Planner" menu under "My Studies." If you're not already using the structure view, click on "Show Examination Regulations Structure." You will then see the course branch (collapsed) and directly below it the exam branch. Only in this section of the structure can exams be registered. The exam branch is identifiable by its name. It begins with "9000-" followed by further course-specific numbers and letters.



- 1. Expand the exam branch to see the module structure of the exams for the study program.
- 2. Expand the module in which the exam you want to register for is located. If an exam is available for registration, you will find the "Register" button in the "Actions" column next to it.
- 3. Click the "Register" button. You will be redirected to a page with further information and legal notices. Please read these carefully and then click "I accept" and "Continue."
- 4. If the exam was correctly registered, it will be marked as "admitted" (zugelassen).



### **Exam Registration for Electives**

If you want to register for an exam in an elective, you must write an E-mail to the student office: master-bwl@uni-mannheim.de

### Late Registration

You can register late for an exam up to three days before the respective exam date (first and second dates, if applicable) in Portal2. For conflict-free planning of your exams, please observe the applicable deadlines.

### Re-registration

You can re-register for written exams from the first date to the second date or vice versa in Portal2 up to three days before the respective first date, provided that registration for the second date is possible for the exam in question. To re-register for an exam, you must first deregister from the already registered exam and then register again for the desired date.

### III. Step-by-Step Registration Guide Reregistration:

### Where:

Log in to Portal2 and open the "Study Planner" menu under "My Studies."

Expand the structure view to the exam you wish to deregister or re-register for and click on the "deregister" button.



1. By clicking "deregister," you completely deregister yourself from the exam.



2. If you want to re-register for a different exam date, click on "Back to Overview" after deregistering from the current date. You will be taken back to the structure view, where you can register for the alternative exam date by clicking "Register," as described at the beginning of the guide.



### **Deregistration**

Deregistration from an exam is possible up to three days before the respective exam date. For core courses this can easily be done in Portal2. The three day-rule also applies to exams that require mandatory registration.

For non-core courses, you can only deregister you from the exam if you have not yet taken or are currently taking any exam associated with the module. During the exam registration period, deregistering from a non-core module can be done via Portal2. Afterwards, you must deregister using the designated <u>withdrawal form</u>. This rule applies to all exams in the elective area business administration, regardless of the type of examination.

After these deadlines, deregistration is no longer possible. You can then only withdraw from the exam upon providing evidence of a valid reason (such as illness) by applying (see guidelines for exam withdrawal).

### IV. Exam Grades

### **DISCLAIMER:**

Contrary to popular belief among many students, there is no automatic "curve" that adjusts exam grades to fit a specific distribution. However, professors do have the discretion to grade more favorably if overall student performance is significantly different than expected or deviates from results in previous years. This can create the impression that a grading curve has been applied, even though that's not formally the case.

For exam evaluation, grades between "1.0" and "5.0" are given. The best possible grade is a 1.0; followed by 1.3, 1.7, 2.0, and so on. Each grade between "1.0" and "4.0" can therefore be differentiated in steps of 0.3 or 0.4 (only for average grade). Every examination evaluated at least a 4.0 is regarded as passed. Every failed examination can be repeated once, with one exception: a one-time-use joker for core courses except CC502 & CC503.

If you fail the exam on your first attempt, you will automatically be registered for the next available re-sit. If you do not wish to take the re-sit, you must actively de-register and then re-register for a future exam, typically during the first exam period of the following year. If the exam was not attempted or failed during a re-sit, the next available opportunity is usually the first exam period of the following year.

### Joker Rule

Generally, you can only repeat failed exams one time. However, there is a "Joker Rule" for the core courses CC 501, CC 504, BE 510 und BE 511: Once during your studies, you may use a second retake for one of these exams.

The courses CC503 & CC502 cannot be attempted a third time. If you fail one of them twice, you must pass the other. For elective courses, if you fail the exam twice, you can simply choose a different module from one of the areas.

### **Studies Abroad**

### **Partner Universities**

The University of Mannheim gives you the opportunity to spend a semester abroad at one of its partner universities during your Master's program. This is part of a traditional exchange semester and requires an application that includes a priority list of preferred partner universities, a letter of motivation, academic transcripts, language certificates, and other relevant documents.

Important Tip: Please note that the University of Mannheim offers a language certificate which is a lot cheaper than common tests such as the TOEFL/IELTS. You can find the most relevant information and information session appointments at the Dean's website:

### Freemover

You also have the opportunity to apply as a "freemover" to universities abroad which are not partner schools of the business faculty of the University of Mannheim. The Dean's Office will give you further information about this option during your first semester.

### **Double Degree**

As another option, you can apply to the Double Degree program of the Business School in order to spend two semesters at one of eight renowned partner universities. The focus of the respective partner university may determine the area of specialization for the remainder of your master's degree. Please note that the application deadline for the Double Degree program will be on the 30. September 2025. This leaves you with the opportunity to apply for a normal semester abroad if you are not accepted to the Double Degree program. ### 2.5 Dean's List & Honors Program

The Honors Program is an offer for particularly high-performing students of the Bachelor of Business Administration and Mannheim Master in Management. In order to be eligible for the Honors Program, you need to make it on the Dean's List after your second semester. The Dean's List is an award for particularly high-performing students on the Bachelor of Business Administration and Mannheim Master in Management degree programs. The List will be drawn at the end of every spring semester. Students will receive an award. Once admitted to the Honors Program it offers selected students the opportunity to take part in additional courses

for further personality development and leadership skills. The focus is on networking with other participants as well as getting in touch with decision-makers from the business world. The program also conveys creative and artistic impulses. ### 2.6 Business Research Option

The Business Research Option is a specialized track within the MMM, tailored for students aiming to pursue a PhD or research-focused career in business. Fully taught in English, the program emphasizes quantitative methods, research design, and empirical analysis. One of the key benefits of the track is its direct link to the Center for Doctoral Studies in Business (CDSB). Students can submit their thesis as a dissertation proposal and, if accepted, enter the PhD phase directly, saving up to one year of study. ### **Events and services**



### 3.3 Campus Overview





### From West to East

### Mensa

This building will be your best friend during exam periods, but of course also during the semester. The cafeteria is open from 11:30 AM to 2:00 PM and offers a wide selection of both meat and vegetarian options. In the cafeteria, there is also the "Greenes" snack bar, which only offers vegetarian and vegan dishes, as well as the Mensa Wagon, which is located in the Ehrenhof. Additionally, you will find various offices of the Mannheim Student Services here, where you can receive advice on various topics, such as student housing or linking your Ecum/student ID with your bank account.

### **A3**

The square A3 is mainly known to students because of room A3-001, which is the largest lecture hall of the university, with space for about 800 students at a time. Also, the library of the Faculty of Humanities is located on the first floor of this building.

### Office of Student Services (L1,1)

The Office of Student Services is the right place to go for questions concerning the administration of your studies, especially your exams. In case of illness, you hand in your doctor's sick notes here

### Dean's Office (L5,5)

The Dean's Office is the management and administration unit.



### BWL-Pool (L7, 2-5, 2nd floor)

The BWL <u>computing pool</u> consists of two rooms equipped with computers which are open to all students of the University of Mannheim. Not only can you use the computers for free, but you can also print cheaper than in the library.

### **Lecture Halls and Names**


A large part of the university is located in the "Schloss", which is the largest Baroque-style palace in Germany. To find your way around, you have to know that the Schloss is divided into different wings whose abbreviations are based on their German names:

- East Wing / Ostflügel (O)
- · Schneckenhof, divided into
- Schneckenhof East / Ost (SO)
- Schneckenhof North / Nord (SN)
- · Schneckenhof West (SW) and
- the Schneckenhof library in the south
- Ehrenhof East / Ost (EO)
- Middle Wing / Mittelbau (M)
- Ehrenhof West (EW)
- West Wing / Westflügel (W)

Apart from that, the university has more lecture halls in squares A5, B6, A3, L7 and L9. Most of the time, your lectures will take place in the Schloss, the lecture hall in A3, and in various rooms in L7 and L9.

The room numbers are based on the different wings. Room EO 150 is therefore located in Ehrenhof East. In this case, the first digit tells you that the room is situated on the first floor of the wing. The rest of the room number just gives you a rough orientation where to look for your lecture hall on that particular floor.

EXAMPLE: EO 150 = Ehrenhof East (wing) 1 (floor level) 50 (room number)
At first this might be confusing – but don't worry, you will find your way around faster than you think!



### **Libraries and Printing**

There are four large libraries where you can study.

While the relevant books, journals and magazines for business administration students can be found in the Schneckenhof Library ("BWLer Bib"), you can use all four libraries for studying. Furthermore, most books that you might need for your courses can be borrowed from the Schloss Westflügel Library (Central Lending Library with Textbook Collection). During the exam period, some libraries (e.g. the Ehrenhof Library) offer extended opening hours.

In addition to the four library areas, which mainly consist of quiet zones, there is the Learning Center. While it does not offer complete silence, it provides an ideal atmosphere for group work. You can access it through the Schneckenhof Library. Since the renovation of the East Wing (EO), newly created learning niches can be found on the top floor, which are also not quiet zones.

As the demand for spots in the libraries is high, especially during the exam period or exam preparation period, it's worth looking at the 'library traffic lights', which show the current occupancy rate of the different areas:

You can <u>print</u> all types of documents in all library areas using your ecUM card. To do so, you'll need to open a separate "printing account" at one of the ecUM terminals (e.g. at the Infocenter of the university library) and transfer money from your ecUM to your printing account.

Printing in the library is convenient for smaller printing jobs which can be sent to the printers via the computers in the libraries or via USB stick. However, in case you want to print a large amount of lecture notes, it's not advisable to use the printers in the university libraries since printing large documents can be pricey. A good alternative is the "BWL Pool" on the second floor of the building in L7, 3-5. Additionally, you can use the BWL Pool to color print and bind your term papers, seminar theses or master theses. Further, several external copy shops are located very close to campus if you want to print or bind documents in a very specific manner.

### 3.4 University of Mannheim

### Dean's Office

Next to the Fachschaft BWL, the Dean's Office is your first point of contact for all issues and questions regarding your studies. It is also our most important partner for all study matters in which we represent you.

### **Chairs and Professors**

For questions about grades and courses, the respective chair of your course is your first point of contact. The University of Mannheim has first-class teaching staff who support you with great expertise during your studies. Take advantage of this offer and direct your academic questions to the respective professor. The chairs are also responsible for grading exams and organizing exam reviews. Here's a tip: it's usually worth attending exam reviews, even if it's just to recount the points.

### **Examination Board**

In case of issues related to uncertainties regarding the study regulations, the Examination Board is available to advise you. For example, the board is responsible for the recognition of grades during your semester abroad or for the recognition of grades and other academic achievements in Mannheim.

### Office for Student Services ("Studienbüro")

The Office for Student Services is responsible for administrative matters, such as:

- transcripts of records (including a preliminary grade average as soon as 30 ECTS are reached)
- registration, de-registration, and re-registration regarding exams as well as cases of deregistration due to sickness
- enrollment certifications / semester fees / renewals of matriculation
- withdrawal from course of study

### 4 Living in Mannheim

### 4.1 General information

### Studium Generale

Studium Generale promotes general education in the form of extracurricular studies. It offers various classes in the fields of foreign language, IT and communication. The fee for a regular class (for example a language class) is 69 Euro per student. For other classes, you should check the website for the exact fee.

### **Institute of Sports**

The Institute of Sports offers a broad program for students and employees of the University of Mannheim. Over 600 sports courses in 82 different disciplines offer you the opportunity to find a balance to your studies. Most courses are offered free of charge.

Each year at the beginning of September, the Sports Day of the Institute takes place at the Mensawiese (green area in front of the Mensa). Here, you can try out different sport disciplines offered by the Institute of Sports and talk to the trainers in charge.

Important to know is that the courses are very sought after and are full very quick. So if you want to do one of the courses try to register as soon as they are online!

### Financing opportunities

### Student assistant and tutor positions

Appealing part-time jobs for students are positions as (unaudited) student/research assistants. Most chairs and institutions of the university, e.g. the international office, regularly look for students for various tasks. In addition to good compensation and proximity to the university, such a student assistant job offers great insights into university processes. You can find all currently available student assistant positions of the business school on the following website.

In contrast, tutor positions are usually posted directly on the chairs' websites. For some classes, the students with the best exam results are contacted directly by the chair. However, this is rarely the case. Should you have excelled in a certain class and are confident that you're capable of being a tutor for this course, it's worth sending an unsolicited application to the respective chair.

### **Career Network**

The University of Mannheim has a job board which is regularly updated with vacancies for internships, working student positions and entry-level career opportunities. An additional feature is the so-called CV Book. Students can upload their CV and make it available to companies. The companies can then contact you if they think your CV is interesting for an open position they have. Oftentimes, you are directly invited to an interview, e.g. during the career fair.


The Career Fair, organized by the Career Network, is a three-day event held every April. About 100 companies participate in the career fair, present themselves and conduct workshops. This presents an excellent opportunity to get in touch with companies and maybe even secure an internship.




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
